

THE RIGHTS OF THE STUDENT IN JUDICIAL SYSTEM

1. The right to review and obtain a copy of all evidence that will be presented against them, in order to prepare for the Formal Hearing.
2. The right to be informed of the identity of known witnesses to the offense and to examine all documents, statements or other evidence that will be presented at the Formal Hearing.
3. The right to request the presence of accuser at the Formal Hearing.
4. The right to be accompanied by an advisor who is not an attorney or enrolled in a law school. The advisor may be any member of the faculty, staff or student body of the University.
5. The right to present position by introducing evidence and witnesses, making statements and cross examining opposing witnesses in accordance with the rules.
6. The right to remain silent.
7. The right to request that any particular Judicial Hearing Council Member not serve on the hearing committee for reasonable cause.
8. The right to receive in writing the decision reached by the judicial council within ten (10) academic days after the decision has been made.
9. The right to discuss the findings of the judicial hearing with the Director of Student Judicial Affairs once notified in writing of the decision.
10. The right to request an appeal of the judicial action taken in accordance with the rules.
